General Patient





Required Fields

At Patient Time

Setting the 'At Patient Time' will establish the first medical contact time.

Patient Name

If patient's name is unknown please enter a value based on current department protocols. An example would be "John Doe".

Destination Hospital

Choose the destination hospital from the list provided. Only hospitals using Pulsara within the region will be available..

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Required Fields

All fields in red are required to start the case.

Scene Departure Time

Once scene departure time is set, the distance to the hospital and ETA will be auto calculated using GPS.

A photo of the Driver's License, ECG, med list, monitor, etc... can be added to the case by tapping the Images/ECG button.

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Optional Patient Information

Age and Gender are optional patient demographics. NOTE: These fields can be important identifiers when the patient arrives to the ED.

Chief Complaint

Chief Complaint is a required field to activate a case. Free text all critical information pertaining to the patient so that your hospital partners can prepare the appropriate resources prior to arrival.



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Activating the Case

Alerting the hospital

Let the hospital know that you are on your way with one simple tap!

Tap 'ALERT' to notify the care team that a new STEMI is in route.

NOTE: Don't forget you can continue to update the case after you have tapped 'Alert'



Vital Signs

Vital signs are optional. Tapping "+ Vitals" will open the vital signs card and vital information can be entered These can also be entered after the case is alerted.

Labs

Typically labs are not drawn in the field. One one that is commonly measured is the blood glucose level Tapping "+ Labs" will open the field where blood glucose can be entered. These can also be entered after the case is alerted.



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
